Mission: We seek to enable individuals to improve the quality of their lives and reach their full potential by treating the disease of chemical dependency through physical, mental and spiritual rehabilitation.

Services: Assessment/Evaluation - The agency provides comprehensive substance abuse evaluations for individuals who are in need of assessing their treatment needs. This service is also available to a variety of agencies/programs who require evaluations as part of their programming needs (Drug Court, courts, DDP, PINS, DWI, etc.)

Education Therapy Program - This service is focused on those who have experienced some level of problems in their lives as a direct result of their alcohol/substance abuse. The program is a minimum of 14 weeks in duration with treatment goals of increasing the awareness of the harmful effects of substance abuse; increased understanding of the disease of chemical dependency/alcoholism; introduction to self-help groups (AA/NA); and the encouragement of self-assessment. This is a non-intensive program which meets one time per week for 1 hour per session to 3 hours per session. There are AM and PM groups available.

Adult Intensive Outpatient Program (IOP Men's, Women's, Co-Ed) - This program is designed to meet the treatment needs of those individuals who are chemically dependent or have failed at the Education Therapy level. It is a medically supervised program. These groups meet two or three times per week in conjunction with Education Therapy for 1.5 hours per session.

Relapse Prevention Program - This program is designed to address the needs of those with previous treatment experience and relapse. The intent is to provide relapse prevention support as a component to intensive treatment, to those clients who live in a supportive environment and may be seeking to remain employed. Relapse Prevention assists participants in evaluating their previous recovery experiences so that they may learn from them and build an even stronger sober support system and recovery program, for ongoing sobriety. Relapse Prevention strongly encourages that each individual establish a sober support system such as AA, NA, or a program of choice.

Young Adult Program - These services are designed to meet the emerging treatment needs of adolescents



between the ages of 12 and 18. The program consists of individual and group treatment designed to provide education on the symptoms and impact of abuse/chemical dependency along with the introduction of skills that will support positive change. Participants are continually evaluated on their participation and implementation of change. Family members are encouraged whenever possible to become involved in the treatment process. Referrals to adolescent inpatient/residential programs are also made if the need arises for a higher level of care.

Medication Assisted Therapy - This program has two components available to C.H.A.D patients engaged in outpatient treatment:

Mental Health - Patients are assessed by a Board certified Physician when mental health issues present in early recovery and throughout treatment. Medication may be prescribed and monitored by regular visits with the physician throughout the course of Outpatient Treatment. Compliance with Outpatient Treatment recommendations is required to participate in this program.

Suboxone Therapy - Patients with a history of Opiate addiction and previous attempts at treatment be assessed by our Physician to determine if they are appropriate for Suboxone Therapy. Frequency of medication/assessment visits is determined by the physician. Compliance with Outpatient Treatment recommendations is required to participate in this program.

Additional programming - CHAD offers additional programs for those in need of a specialized focus, or for those interested in furthering their progress in recovery.

Additional treatment programs - offered include Dual-Recovery, co-Dependency, Men's Trauma, Women's Trauma and Spirituality.

Family Education Program - the Family Education Program is free to the public each Wednesday evening from 6:30-7:30pm.

Addiction is a family disease and CHAD recognizes that often family members and loved ones are also in need of education and support.

Cayuga County Jail Program - The services are basic assessment and screening for substance abuse/dependency with the intent to facilitate the referral to the indicated level of care such as outpatient, inpatient or detoxification. Local judges, attorneys, and family members utilize this service. If you wish to request the program, please call or write the agency, which in turn will instruct the jail counselor to seek out the inmate to gather the necessary information.

Prevention Program - The prevention program consists of two school-based services:

The Dart Program is a science-based primary prevention program designed to meet the needs of school aged youths in grades K-6. The program is designed to match the developmental needs and learning styles of all the participants. It focuses on substance abuse as a health issue and it is provided in the classroom setting in all rural Cayuga County elementary schools.

The Intervention Program is intended to provide assessment and individual brief counseling to at-risk youth in the home school setting in Union Springs, Cato-Meridian, and Moravia school districts. The service also provides referrals to treatment or other programs that the students may need.

Services include assessment and treatment planning; individual, group, and family therapies; medication evaluation, therapy, and education; symptom management; and crisis intervention services.

Single Point of Access - SPOA was established to ensure that effective and comprehensive services are provided to individuals with mental health service needs. The Cayuga County Community Mental Health Center coordinates both the County's Adult and Child SPOA programs. The SPOA committees consist of community service providers who meet regularly to coordinate and plan services for those individuals in need. Requests for SPOA can be made by completing the SPOA application and returning it to the SPOA Coordinator at the Mental Health Center or faxing to the SPOA Coordinator at (315) 253-1687. Care Management - The Care Management Program is for people with complicated health needs that include multiple chronic health conditions and /or on-going psychiatric conditions. Care Managers work with people to identify their needs and make a plan of care to meet these needs. The Care Manager will help the individual to manage this plan of care by accessing appropriate services in various systems of care, facilitate communication across health care providers, and assist the individual in following the plan of care. Community referrals for Care Management can be made through SPOA.

Children's Intensive Case Management - Provides specialized on-going, community support and service coordination for children with mental health needs. Referrals are made through SPOA. Crisis Services - A crisis service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. During business hours, patients may walk in or call (315) 253-0341. After business hours, patients may call (315) 253-0341 and the call will be forwarded to Contact Community Services and calls will be screened by their trained crisis line staff. Professional Mental Health Center staff will provide consultation as needed. Phone: (315) 253-0341 to access crisis services. Early Intervention Program (EIP) - A statewide program to ensure that infants and toddlers with developmental delays or known disabilities and their families receive needed services in a timely way. Program provides screening and evaluation of cognitive, physical including vision and hearing, communications, social-emotional and self-help or adaptive skill development. Any infant or child birth to two years old residing in Cayuga County who has suspect developmental concern is eligible for referral to this program. Once eligible, services are rendered via and IFSP or Individualized Family Service Plan written and overseen by a Service Coordinator or "case manager". There is no out-of-pocket cost for families although Medicaid and NYS-regulated health insurance must be billed for services. *Child Find is a component of EIP where children who are "at risk" for developmental delay are tracked via parent questionnaires to insure that necessary diagnostic and treatment service are available to and utilized by families of high risk infants and toddlers as soon as a disability is evident. **Phone:** (315) 253-1560.

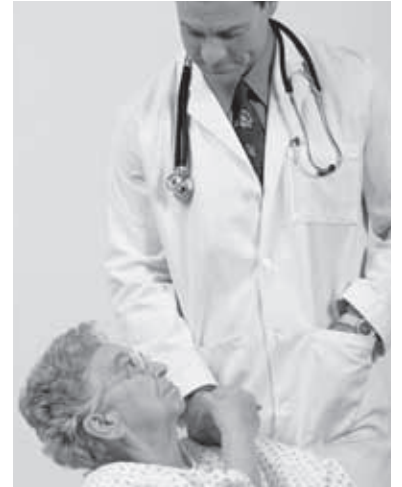

Mission: The NYS Mental Hygiene Law establishes Community Services Boards in every county and sets forth the composition and function of the Board for each county. In non-charter counties, such as Cayuga, the Board is a policy-making one and participates in and approves the plans which are submitted to each of the Mental Hygiene Agencies: Office of Mental Health, Office of Mental Retardation/ Developmental Disabilities, Office of Alcoholism and Substance Abuse. The CSB sets priorities for State Aid funding and recommends priorities for local funding to the County Legislature. The CSB also oversees the County Department of Mental Health and its contract agencies.

In general, CSBs act to assure that county citizens have affordable access to services and supports that are necessary to assist them in being productive, healthy, caring, and contributing members of the community. The CSBs ensure that service recipients and other interested parties play an integral part in the planning, development, and monitoring of the service system.

Services: The CSB, depending whether it is in a non-charter or charter county participates in planning, reviewing and overseeing all services to the mentally disabled within its geographic area and advising the Mental Health Dept. and the County Legislature on those services. Typical Board functions include identifying needs of persons with mental disabilities; promote and assist in the development of local programs; establishment of system-wide priorities; develop short and long range goals; establishment of a local annual plan; research funding options and access funding; assure compliance to standards established by the State offices that provide certification and funding, as well as any locally developed standards.

The CSB is comprised of fifteen (15) persons from the community that have demonstrated an interest in the field of services for persons with mental disabilities. The CSB has three standing subcommittees Alcoholism and Substance Abuse Subcommittee, Mental Health Subcommittee and Subcommittee for People with Developmental Disabilities. These subcommittees are comprised of CSB members and other interested persons from the community. The subcommittees represent the community's interests in each area and serve to assist the Board.

All meetings are open to the Public and are generally held at the Mental Health Center, 146 North St., Auburn.

Volunteer Opportunities: Community residents who have an interest in services for the mentally disabled are welcome to attend meetings of the CSB and its three subcommittees on mental health, developmental disabilities, and alcoholism and substance abuse. Membership on the CSB and Subcommittees requires that a person be recommended to the County Legislature where appointments are made.

These services include: housing advocacy (this can include assistance with locating and applying for permanent housing, transportation to appointments with landlords or other housing agencies, providing access to housing information including landlord lists, apartment listings, and housing applications for both public and private housing complexes and provide advocacy with landlords who may be reluctant to rent to victims with poor or insufficient rental or credit histories); safety planning and safety devices for your home; vocational assistance, job skills training, job search assistance counseling, flexible, ongoing rental subsidies and assistance with paying security deposits; financial literacy and credit repair; and follow-up services for a minimum of three months after exit from the program.

Supervised Visitation/Safe Exchange Center - provides a monitored, supervised location to facilitate visitation and exchange of children in situations involving domestic violence, sexual assault, dating violence, child abuse, or stalking. Services: The E. John Gavras Center is an evaluation and treatment facility in Cayuga County providing educational, therapeutic, OPWDD, and respite care to individuals with special needs from birth through adult. The service area includes Cayuga, Seneca, Wayne, Onondaga and Tompkins Counties.

Preschool - The preschool offers programming for 3-5 year olds on a half day basis. Class time in both the morning and the afternoon runs for 2 1/2 hours. Certified teachers use a curriculum based on developmentally appropriate practices aligned with New York State Standards. Our teams have the expertise to teach children of all abilities the skills needed for kindergarten readiness and success. Our caring professionals offer learning experiences which ensure growth and independence for each and every child. Classrooms are integrated settings with multi disciplinary team support including speech, occupational and physical therapist.

Special Education Itinerant Teacher (SEIT) - Certified Special Education Teachers are available to support children in community and home settings. Itinerant teachers work with the staff at community preschools and with families to foster a better understanding of the child's strengths, needs, and learning style.

Therapy Services - The E John Gavras Center offers assessment and treatment of speech, language, swallowing and voice disorders serving individuals from birth through adulthood. Patients who utilize our Medicare approved site may need services due to a stroke, traumatic brain injury, Parkinson's Disease, ALS, aging or Multiple Sclerosis. Services are provided in acute and sub acute care settings. These services include a variety of developmental and physical disorders. Vital Stimulation Therapy is now available to treat clients with swallowing disorders. Speech/Language, Physical and Occupational Therapy can be provided to area school districts on a contract basis and is available to families privately.

Medicaid Service Coordination - A program operated under the New York State Office of Persons with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) to provide support, advocacy and coordination of services to individuals diagnosed with a developmental disability. Service Coordination is based on the principle of a "Person Centered Approach" to planning services and supports. These supports and services could include accessing funding for services, advocacy in a variety of settings, such as school or work, making referrals, facilitating meetings and maintaining benefits and eligibility. The Medicaid Service Coordinator is a person chosen by an individual, his or her family or legal guardian, who assists the person in identifying the type of help needed to attain his or her goals and aspirations of life.

Group Day Habilitation - A Medicaid Waiver program operated under the auspices of OPWDD, the Group Day habilitation services help individuals with daily life activities and in making rewarding connections and relationships within their communities. These services are very flexible and can be provided almost anywhere in the community an individual wishes to learn new skills. At the E John Gavras Center we provide this service in a group setting for individuals 16 years of age and older. Waiver Respite- change to the following- Friday evening respite provides recreational activities, games, dinner and outings in a group setting. The group meets on Fridays from 3:00 to 7:00 at the North Street location. There is a monthly schedule. Sometimes the group goes out into the community for fun and other times they stay here. This group is for individuals with developmental disabilities ages 16 and up (3 to 1 ratio). The program gives participants the opportunity to practice their living skills with their peers and work within a group setting. Contact your Medicaid Service Coordinator to review the information and make a referral to the program. The Program Coordinator will review information and set up an intake with family and participant. It is that easy!

Community Habilitation - A Medicaid Waiver program operated under OPWDD, the Community Habilitation services help individuals with daily life activities in their home environment and community. The services may be provided at any time of day; as long as similar Medicaid funded services (e.g. day habilitation services or state plan services) are not provided at the same time. At the E. John Gavras Center, these services are provided on a one to one basis (one direct service provider to one consumer), which allows for a more flexible, individualized program. In the Individualized Service Plan, a person has identified meaningful outcomes that staff assists and support the individual in attaining.

Individual Residential Alternatives - These are residential homes where 24 hour supervision is provided to consumers. They are designed to promote independence, integration inclusion, and allow individuals to be productive as possible within the community. The Center's focus is on maintaining the IRA as the consumer's home. Staff focuses on skill development and oversees the activities of a consumer's daily living and health needs.

Waiver Respite - Friday evening respite provides services for individuals with developmental disabilities ages 16 and up (3 to 1 ratio). The program provides activities in meal planning/preparation and projects that help build creativity and imagination. The group meets on Fridays from 3:00pm to 7:00pm at the Cranebrook location. Contact your Medicaid Service Coordinator to review the information and make a referral to the program.

Mission: Seneca Cayuga ARC is a not-for-profit agency comprised of people dedicated to assisting and supporting individuals with disabilities, their families, and the community. Seneca Cayuga ARC provides opportunities and choices for treatment, employment, education, recreation, and community living to assist individuals with disabilities in realizing a productive and fulfilling life.

Services: Autism Services

C.H.A.N.C.E.S. - Offers services to families who have a child with autism or an autism spectrum disorder.

This program provides a parent support group coordinated by an LCSW-R. There are presently two groups: one for parents of teenagers and one for parents of children of any age. Offers educational opportunities for your child to try new skills at home or in the community and respite by direct support professionals.

Community Habilitation - Through this service, people build and retain the skills necessary to become more independent in some aspect of life. Services will take place in the home and community i.e., learning, cooking homemaking skills, personal care, banking, purchasing groceries, using the community resources like the library or trying new hobbies like bowling, gardening etc. Hab services are designed to assist participants in acquiring, retaining and improving the self-help, socialization and adaptive skills necessary to reside successfully in home and community.

Community Services - Provides support to people with disabilities and their families. Cayuga County programs provide service coordination, benefit management assistance, legal and educational advocacy, crisis assistance, individual habilitation services, family reimbursement, parent support, guardianship information, respite assistance, summer camp, family supports and services, fiscal management services, individual supports and services and self-directed services.

Consumer-Directed Personal Assistance (CDPA) - An in-home program which allows individuals to hire and train an attendant of their choice to assist them with their personal care. Staff assists individuals (or their representatives) in learning the process of hiring, training, supervising and scheduling their own assistants.

Respite: Provides small group social/recreational outings through hourly respite.

Transition Support: This program assists families with school-age children who are developmentally

disabled or dually-diagnosed and who exhibit challenging behaviors which present a potential roadblock to their success. Staff work with students who may have difficulty with the transition from school to adult services. Services are coordinated with school, community and home with the goal of increasing the individual's skills. Clinicians also work with students 17 to 21 years old who may have difficulty with the transition from school to adult services. This Clinic Transition Support program would provide clinical assessment of the student in natural settings, education and support to parents and appropriate school personnel, and education to provide guidance to the family, school personnel and support professionals involved.

DAY PROGRAMS Alzheimer's Services - This program is available one day per week for adults who suffer from memory loss, dementia, confusion, and Alzheimer's disease. The program is designed to meet individual needs and to promote an environment that is safe and stimulating, while allowing caregivers needed time away.

Camp Columbus - Located on Owasco Lake, is the agency's summer day camp for children and adults with developmental disabilities. Activities include field sports, music, drama, arts and crafts, swimming, and fishing. The waterfront has a wheelchair accessible lift.

Day Habilitation - Each Day Habilitation program is specifically designed to meet individual needs. Program sites are available that are suitable for the young and active, the elderly, and everything in between. People with all levels of need are welcome; each person's program is designed based on their abilities and preferences. On-site activities might include basic daily living skills, or include Instruction in areas such as cooking, computer training, gardening and artistic expression. Community outings could include bowling, shopping, dining, or volunteering at many area not-for-profit organizations. Clinical services are available based on individual need and physician order.

F.A.M.E. Center for Creative Expression - This theatrical program provides opportunities for people with disabilities through creative expression in acting, singing, dancing, art, stand-up comedy and playwriting. There are also behind-the-scene choices, such as costume making, set construction and technical production opportunities. There are usually two performances per year.

Karl D. Warner Clinic - Provides individuals with psychological assessment and diagnoses for OPWDD eligibility for services, including Autism Spectrum Disorders. The Article 16 clinic provides individuals with developmental disabilities convenient access to a wide variety of habilitative services, including psychiatry, occupational therapy, psychology, physical therapy, social work, nursing services, speech services, nutrition and rehabilitation counseling. These services are provided on a per-visit basis at various community locations. Intensive Clinical Services are available for those individuals identified. A clinical team provides these services in conjunction with programs, schools, residential staff or parents at home.

Intensive Behavioral Services (IBS): An HCBS Waiver service for individuals residing in settings not certified by OPWDD and who present with substantial challenging behaviors that put them at imminent risk of placement in a more restrictive living environment. The focus is on clinical and behavioral treatment and intervention to prevent behaviors from reaching crisis level.

Transportation Services - are provided (to and from their homes) for all individuals enrolled in agency programs. Passenger safety is a primary concern; all vehicles are regularly maintained and equipped with two-way radios for safety. Key staff is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. The fleet includes buses equipped with wheelchair lifts.

Vocational Services - are offered through Supported Employment, Enhanced Supported Employment, Integrated Pre-Vocational Services, and Job Track create a full range of opportunities. Each person is able to work at his or her optimal skill level while meaning a paycheck and enjoying the satisfactions of meaningful work. The vocational programs are integrated with our Lifestyles Personal Enrichment Program.

RESIDENTIAL SERVICES:

The residential program offers choices in living arrangements for adults who are over the age of 18 and who have a developmental disability. Options include ten Individual Residential Alternatives (IRA's) in Cayuga County. These houses are home to 4 or 5 people; all homes provide 24-hour supervision, guidance, and support from staff.

There are also five 24-hour supervised apartments in Cayuga County (for up to ten individuals). Supportive IRA's are also available in both counties for persons who are prepared for a more independent lifestyle and who do not require 24-hour supports. Planned respite is available at our Shevchenko IRA on weekends only, on a rotational basis.

Eligibility: Individuals must meet OPWDD eligibility for Waiver Services and must be Medicaid-eligible. Some vocational programs require Eligibility for VESID guidelines.
